DIVISION I - ADULT HORTICULTURE CULTIVARS

RULES:

Open to any adult amateur grower. Competition is open to the world. Entry fee is the purchase of an Exhibitor's Ticket or the payment of fifty cents per entry at the Secretary's Office. Entries will be accepted from 8:00 A.M. to 11:30 A.M., Monday, July 27, 2009. The Knox County Fair Board asks that all vehicles be removed from the midway by 11:00 A.M. Open Judging by the OAGC Standard System will be 1:00 P.M. Monday, July 27, 2009. Entries MUST BE REMOVED Wednesday evening, July 29, or before 8 A.M. Thursday morning.

Exhibitor's name, address and exhibitor number must appear on entry tag. No reservations are necessary. Entry tags should be picked up at the Fair Board Office. Tags must be made out in advance.

All cultivars are to be grown by exhibitor **and correctly labeled on entry tags as to variety to be eligible for competition**. More than one entry per class is allowed, provided each entry is a different variety. Cultivars should be well groomed and should be disbudded unless being shown as a stem, spray or scape. Foliage should not be removed.

Exhibitor is to furnish clear glass containers that are heavy enough to support plant material for all cultivars. Small water tubes will be provided for miniature roses. Paper plates will be provided for vegetables. Green styrofoam will be available for use as blocks for large heavy cultivars.

Container grown plants, except for Classes 77, 81, 82, 113 and 114, should be in the possession of exhibitor for at least 3 months to be eligible for competition. Section K (container grown plants) will remain for the duration of the Fair.

The Flower Show Committee shall not be responsible for breakage, theft or loss of property. The Committee reserves the right to combine, divide or eliminate classes to insure a uniform show. Judges' decisions are final.

Classes 1 - 104: 1st - \$2.00, 2nd - \$1.75, 3rd - \$1.50, 4th - ribbon

Class 105: 1st - \$7.00, 2nd - \$5.00, 3rd - \$3.00, 4th - \$2.00

Class 106 - 114: (Container Grown Plants) 1st - \$3.00, 2nd - \$2.50, 3rd - \$2.00, 4th - ribbon

Best of Show: Rosette and \$5.00 for each Section (A,B,C,D,E,F,G,H,I,J,K). Class 105 (Vegetable Basket) not eligible for Best of Show. Premiums will be paid in class subdivisions. Premiums, ribbons and rosettes will be awarded as deemed worthy by the judge.

SECTION A - ROSES

Class 1-**Hybrid Tea, White or Near White, Yellow or Yellow Blend**--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.

Class 2-**Hybrid Tea, Pink or Pink Blend, Red or Red Blend, Orange or Orange Blend**--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.

Class 3-**Hybrid Tea, Any other color** --one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.

Class 4-**Miniature Rose, White or Near White, Yellow or Yellow Blend**--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.

Class 5-**Miniature Rose, Pink or Pink Blend, Red or Red Blend, Orange or Orange Blend**--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.

Class 6-**Miniature Rose, Any other color**--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.

Class 7-**Miniature Rose**, one spray, not disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.

Class 8-**Grandiflora**, one stem with one bloom or one stem with multiple blooms and buds, foliage attached, any variety, named.

Class 9-**Floribunda**, one stem, not disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.

SECTION B - DAHLIAS

Every entry must include sufficient foliage to permit its proper evaluation; usually at least one full set of leaves

Class 10-**Decorative Type** (6" or over)--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.

Class 11-**Cactus Type** (6" or over)--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.

Class 12- **Medium Flowered** (4" to 6")--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any type, any variety, named.

Class 13-**Miniature** (2" to 4")--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any type, any variety, named.

Class 14-**Pompom** (2" or under)--three blooms of same variety and color, disbudded with foliage attached, named.

SECTION C - GLADIOLUS

- Class 15-**Miniature** (100-200 size)--**White** (00-01)--**Green** (02-09); **Yellow** (10-19); **Orange** (20-29); **Salmon** (30-39); one spike, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 16-**Miniature** (100-200 size)--**Pink** (40-49); **Red** (50-59); **Rose** (60-69); **Lavender** (70-79); **Violet** (80-89); **Smokies, Tan, Brown** (90-99)—one spike, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 17-**White** (00-01); (300-500 size)--one spike, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 18-**Green** (02-09); **Yellow** (10-19); (300-500 size)--one spike, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 19-**Orange** (20-29); **Salmon** (30-39); (300-500 size)--one spike, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 20-**Pink** (40-49); (300-500 size)--one spike, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 21-**Red** (50-59); **Rose** (60-69); (300-500 size)--one spike, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 22-**Lavender** (70-79); **Violet** (80-89); (300-500 size)--one spike, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 23-**Smokies, Tan, Brown** (90-99); (300-500 size)--one spike, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.

SECTION D - HEMEROCALLIS (DAYLILY)

- Class 24-**Small Flowering**-- (3" or more to under 4.5" in diameter) one scape, any variety, named.
- Class 25-**White, Near White, Cream Solid, Cream Blend, Green Solid or Green Blend**--one scape, any variety, named.
- Class 26-**Yellow Solid or Yellow Blend**--one scape, any variety, named.
- Class 27-**Orange Solid or Orange Blend**--one scape, any variety, named.
- Class 28-**Pink Solid or Pink Blend**--one scape, any variety, named.
- Class 29 **Lavender Solid or Lavender Blend**—one scape, any variety, named.
- Class 30-**Red Solid or Red Blend, Wine Solid or Wine Blend, Brown Solid or Brown Blend**--one scape, any variety, named.
- Class 31-**Purple Solid or Purple Blend**—one scape, any variety, named.
- Class 32-**Bi-Color** (two distinct colors on one flower)--one scape, any variety, named.
- Class 33-**Double** (consistently more than six segments)--one scape, any variety, named.
- Class 34-**Spider**—one scape, any variety, named.
- Class 35-**Unusual Form**—one scape, any variety, named.

SECTION E - MARIGOLDS

- Class 36-**Large Carnation or Chrysanthemum Flowered**--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named. (Example: Climax Series, Odorless, Jubilee, Gold Coin, Lemon Mum, Simba, etc.)
- Class 37-**Medium Flowered**--compact, medium to tall plants, medium length stems with medium to large blooms; one bloom, disbudded, with foliage attached, any variety, named. (Example: Happy Face, Ladies series, Inca II, Perfection, Antigua, Discover, Galore, etc.).
- Class 38-**Small Flowered**--short plants with semi to full doubles, crested doubles, one spray*, not disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named, of solid color. (Example: Petite series, Sophia series, Janie, Boy-O-Boy series, Gypsy, etc.).
- Class 39-**Small Flowered**--short plants with semi to full doubles, crested doubles, one spray*, not disbudded with foliage attached, any bi-colored variety, named. (Example: Petite series, Honeycomb, Queen Sophia, Aurora, Boy-O-Boy, Red Pygmy, etc.).
- Class 40-**Single Marigolds**--one row of petals and a crested or raised center, one spray*, not disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named. (Example: Red Wheels, Marietta series, Golden Gem, Lulu, Paprika, Disco, etc.).

*Definition of a spray—a single main stem with blooms or florets borne on pedicels or lateral branches, led by a terminal bloom which blooms first.

SECTION F - ZINNIAS

- Class 41-**Large Cactus Type** (4" or over)--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 42-**Large Dahlia Type** (4" or over)--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 43-**Medium Flowered** (3" to 4")--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 44-**Small Flowered** (1_ to 3")--three blooms of same named variety and color, disbudded with foliage attached.
- Class 45-**Collection of Large Cactus Type, Large Dahlia Type or Medium Flowered Type**--three blooms of the same type, named, each a different color, disbudded with foliage attached.
- Class 46- **Profusion Zinnia**--three blooms of same named variety and color, disbudded with foliage attached.

SECTION G - ANNUALS, PERENNIALS AND HERBS

- Class 47-**SPECIAL CLASS**--New variety of annual/perennial, newly introduced for 2008 - 2009, one bloom (disbudded), one spray or one spike, with foliage attached, named.
- Class 48-**Snapdragon**--one spike, with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 49-**Petunia**--single or double flowered, one spray, more than one bloom, with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 50-**Wave Petunia**—single or double flowered, one spray, more than one bloom, with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 51-**Small Decorative Sunflower**--one bloom, disbudded, with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 52-**Any Other Round Form Annual** not listed above--three blooms of same variety, named, disbudded with foliage attached.

- Class 53-**Any Other Spike Form Annual** not listed above--one spike, with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 54-**Any Other Spray Form Annual** not listed above--one spray, not disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 55-**Summer Flowering Annual Bulb or Tuber or Rhizome or Corm** not listed above—one bloom or one stem or one spike, any variety named. Foliage not required.
- Class 56-**Hybrid Lily**--one stem, with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 57-**Salvia** (Victoria Blue or White)--three stems of same variety, named, with foliage attached.
- Class 58-**Rudbeckia (Gloriosa Daisy)**--three blooms of same variety, named, disbudded with foliage attached.
- Class 59-**Shasta Daisy**--three blooms of same variety, named, disbudded with foliage attached.
- Class 60-**Echinacea** (Coneflower)--three blooms of same variety, named, disbudded with foliage attached.
- Class 61-**Achilles** (Yarrow)--three blooms of same variety, named, foliage attached.
- Class 62-**Small Ornamental Grasses**--three stems of same variety, named, in one container, not to exceed 36" in height, foliage only; or grasses with inflorescence (plumes, flower heads) (including Carex, Helictotrichon, Imperata, etc.).
- Class 63-**Medium Ornamental Grasses**--three stems of same variety, named, in one container, not to exceed 36" in height, foliage only; or grasses with inflorescence (plumes, flower heads) (including Chasmathium, Elymus, Panicum, Pennisetum, etc.).
- Class 64-**Large Ornamental Grass**--one stem, named, not to exceed 36" in height, foliage only; or grass with inflorescence (plume, flower head) (including Arundo, Erianthus, Miscanthus, Ornamental Corn, etc.).
- Class 65-**Any Other Round Form Perennial** not listed above--three blooms of same variety, named, disbudded with foliage attached.
- Class 66-**Any Other Spike Form Perennial** not listed above--one spike, with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 67-**Any Other Spray Form Perennial** not listed above--one spray, not disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 68-**Everlastings** not listed above (annual or perennial)-- fresh, one spray, three blooms of same variety, named, or three spikes of same variety, named, with foliage attached.
- Class 69-**Any Other Foliage**—one stem, any variety, named.
- Class 70-**Flowering Shrub**—one stem, any variety, named, foliage attached.

SECTION H – HOSTAS

Each hosta entry must be a mature leaf and be typical of cultivar

- Class 71-**Hosta**-one leaf, green (all shades), named, any variety.
- Class 72-**Hosta**-one leaf, blue (all shades), named, any variety.
- Class 73-**Hosta**-one leaf, yellow (all shades), named, any variety.
- Class 74-**Hosta**-one leaf, margined or variegated (all shades), named, any variety.
- Class 75-**Hostas**- three leaves, named, each leaf a different variety, in one container.
- Class 76-**Hostas**-five leaves, named, each leaf a different variety, in one container.
- Class 77-**Hosta(s)**-container grown, named, any variety(ies).

SECTION I - HERBS

- Class 78-**Herb**-annual, fresh, one stem any variety, named.
- Class 79-**Herb**-perennial, fresh, one stem any variety, named.
- Class 80-**Collection of Herbs**-fresh, collection of five stems, one each of five different varieties, named.
- Class 81-**Scented Geranium**-container grown, one plant, named, any variety.
- Class 82-**Herb**-container grown, one plant, named, any variety.

SECTION J - VEGETABLES

- Class 83-**SPECIAL CLASS**--New variety of vegetable, newly introduced for 2008-2009, shown as to type, any variety, named.
- Class 84-**Peas**--five pods, named, any variety.
- Class 85-**Green Beans**--five pods, named, any variety.
- Class 86-**Yellow Beans**--five pods, named, any variety.
- Class 87-**Purple Onions**--three onions, named, any variety.*
- Class 88-**Yellow Onions**--three onions, named, any variety.*
- Class 89-**White Onions**--three onions, named, any variety.*
- *Classes 87, 88 and 89--roots should be removed just below the base of the bulb, the jagged and dirty outer scales should be removed, tops should be cut off 1/2 to 1 inch above bulb.
- Class 90-**Beets**--three beets, named, any variety, tops should be removed to 1 inch above crown, tap root left on, minor roots to be removed.
- Class 91-**Carrots**--three carrots, named, any variety, tops should be trimmed to 1 inch above base, tap root left on.
- Class 92-**Cucumbers**--three cucumbers, named, any variety, 1/4 inch of stem should be left on.
- Class 93-**Red or Yellow Tomatoes**--three tomatoes, named, any variety, to be exhibited with stem end down; stem and calyx removed.
- Class 94-**Small Tomatoes**— one cluster attached to stem, named, any variety, can be all stages of maturity. (Ex: cherry, grape, pear,

etc.).

Class 95-**Sweet Peppers**--three peppers, named, any variety, 1/2 inch of stem should be left on.

Class 96-**Hot Peppers**--five peppers, named, any variety, 1/2 inch of stem should be left on.

Class 97-**White or Red Potatoes**--three potatoes, named, any variety.

Class 98-**Cabbage**--one head, named, any variety, outer leaves to be removed except 2 to 4 wrapper (leaves that cradle the head) leaves.

Class 99-**Cauliflower**--one head, named, any variety, leaves to be removed except about 6 or enough to protect the head; these should be trimmed neatly about 1 inch above the curd.

Class 100-**Broccoli**--one head, named, any variety, not less than 3 inches in diameter with part of the main stem attached, leaves should remain.

Class 101-**Zucchini**--one zucchini, **edible** size, named, any variety.

Class 102-**Squash**--one squash, **edible** size, named, any variety.

Class 103-**Sweet Corn**--three ears, husks removed, named, any variety.

Class 104-**Any Other Vegetable or Fruit**-- not listed above, named, any one variety; 1 large or 5 medium or 10 small.

Class 105-**Vegetables In A Basket**--a display of any number of seven or more named varieties of vegetables, accessory leaves and herbs permitted, to be staged in a 30" x 30" table space. Quality, number and rarity of the items making up the group, as well as horticultural perfection, will be considered in judging the display. A 3 x 5 card listing all horticulture materials must accompany the display.

**SECTION K - CONTAINER GROWN PLANTS
To Remain Duration of the Fair**

Class 106-**African Violet**—single crown, single or double bloom, any named variety.

Class 107-**Foliage Plant**—one plant per pot (may be multiple stemmed), any named variety.

Class 108-**Flowering Plant**—one plant per pot (may be multiple stemmed), any named variety.

Class 109-**Cactus or Succulent**—one plant per pot (may be multiple stemmed), any named variety.

Class 110-**Fern**—one plant per pot (may be multiple stemmed), any named variety.

Class 111-**Flowering Hanging Basket**—any one named variety of plant or plants.

Class 112-**Foliage Hanging Basket**—any one named variety of plant or plants.

Class 113-**Container Garden**-three or more plants of different named varieties.

Class 114-**Miniature Landscape**-three or more different named plants and garden “accents” in one container (an established garden scene using the principles of design—balance, scale, color, proportion, rhythm, contrast, unity, dominance). Accessories permitted. Not to exceed 15” in any direction. See OAGC Handbook pp. 60-61.

**DIVISION II - ADULT ARTISTIC SHOW
THEME: “REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE”**

RULES:

Open to any adult amateur arranger (sections A and B) or any adult professional arranger, student judge or judge (section B). Competition is open to the world. Entry fee is the purchase of an Exhibitor's Ticket or the payment of fifty cents per entry at the Secretary's Office. Exhibits may be entered from 8:00 A.M. to 11:30 A.M. Thursday, July 30, 2009. The Knox County Fair Board asks that all vehicles be removed from the midway by 11:00 A.M. Thursday. Open oral judging by the OAGC Standard System will be at 1:00 P.M., Thursday, July 30, 2009. Entries may not be removed until Sunday, August 2, 2009 from **1:00 P.M. to 2:00 P.M.** Premium checks may be obtained from Audrey Spearman at that time.

Exhibitor's name, address, and exhibitor's number must appear on entry tag. Entry tags should be picked up at the Fair Board Office. Tags must be made out in advance. Each arrangement must be accompanied by a 3 x 5 card listing all plant material used. Interpretation card may be included if desired. Exhibitors may make only one entry per class.

No artificial plant material may be used. Painted material is permitted in all classes except where stated otherwise. No fresh plant material may be painted. Accessories are permitted in any class. **Garden grown or roadside plant materials are preferred over florist plant material for artistic designs.**

Limited space will be provided for assembly of arrangements before reaching entry and classification table. Creative designs may be assembled where staged.

Caution will be exercised, but the committee is not responsible for breakage, theft or loss of property. Judge's decision is final.

1st - \$5.00 2nd - \$4.00 3rd - \$3.00 4th - ribbon

Best of Show - Rosette and \$10.00--Section A (classes 1-10) and Section B (classes 11-26)

Most Creative - Rosette and \$10.00--Section A (classes 1-10) and Section B (classes 11-26)

Premiums, ribbons and rosette will be awarded as deemed worthy by the judge.

SECTION A - ARTISTIC DESIGNS

OPEN TO AMATEURS - ANY INDIVIDUAL OR GARDEN CLUB MEMBER

- Class 1—**Keeping Our Kokosing River Clean**—A design featuring water. Can be either open water or underwater design.
- Class 2—**Solar Power**—A design incorporating bright colors.
- Class 3—**Reducing Our Energy Use**—A small design not to exceed 8" in any direction. To be staged on a platform provided by the show committee.
- Class 4—**SPECIAL CLASS: Dining in Nature**—An interpretative design on the "green" theme, using a breakfast tray. Must include a flower arrangement. Explain interpretation on a 3 x 5 card. No painted material. See OAGC Handbook p. 393.
- Class 5—**Exercise! Take a Hike**—A design incorporating treasured wood. No painted material.
- Class 6—**Wind Power**—A design showing motion.
- Class 7—**Compost Tea**—A design in a teapot.
- Class 8—**Plastic Again**—A design incorporating recyclable plastic.
- Class 9—**Using Less**—A design using one flower.
- Class 10—**"Green" Designers**—A class for NOVICE arrangers, with choice of designs. A "design" is an orderly creation of horticulture components according to the principles of balance, scale, color, proportion, rhythm, contrast, unity and dominance. A Novice is one who has not won a blue ribbon prior to this show.

SECTION B - ARTISTIC DESIGNS

OPEN TO AMATEURS - ANY INDIVIDUAL OR GARDEN CLUB MEMBER

PROFESSIONAL DESIGNER, STUDENT JUDGE OR JUDGE

- Class 11—**SPECIAL CLASS: Look What I Found!**—An assemblage of found items. An Assemblage is a three dimensional, abstract design containing plant material and unrelated objects, into an integrated whole. See OAGC Handbook, pp. 356-358, type #1.
- Class 12—**Roadside Clean-Up**—A design using at least one piece of recyclable trash and roadside plant materials.
- Class 13—**We "Dig" Green**—A design incorporating a garden tool(s).
- Class 14—**Let's Keep It "Green"**—An all foliage design. No painted material
- Class 15—**Paper or Plastic? Neither!**—A decorated shopping bag using horticultural materials.
- Class 16—**Taking the Plunge to "Green"**—A design using a plunger.
- Class 17—**Reducing Water Pollution**—A design featuring water. Can be either open water or underwater design.
- Class 18—**Dining in Nature**—A design incorporating a picnic basket, using all fresh plant material and including picnic accessories. No painted material.
- Class 19—**Extra, Extra, Read All About It**—A design incorporating newspaper (s).
- Class 20—**Renewable Resources**—An interpretative design incorporating a renewable resource(s) (such as cotton, wool, wood, bamboo, grass). Explain interpretation on a 3 x 5 card.
- Class 21—**Turning Trash to Treasure**—A design using a container not originally intended to be a flower container.
- Class 22—**"Forever Green" Bag**—A design incorporating fruits and/or vegetables and/or foliage. No painted material.
- Class 23—**Self-Composting Toilet**—An interpretative design. Explain interpretation on a 3 x 5 card.
- Class 24—**Reduce, Reuse, Recycle**—A traditional or creative mass design.
- Class 25—**Using the Recycle Bins**—A synergistic design. A synergistic design is a creative design; a grouping of plant materials, containers, and/or other components sharing common characteristics designed to create an artistic whole. See OAGC Handbook pp. 373-374.
- Class 26—**Welcome to Our "Green" Home**—A wreath using fresh and/or dried materials. No painted material.

DIVISION III - JUNIOR HORTICULTURE CULTIVARS

RULES:

Open to any member of a 4-H Club or to any junior gardener 19 years and under. No entry fee or reservation needed. Entries will be accepted from 8:00 A.M. to 11:30 A.M., Monday July 27, 2009. Open judging by the OAGC Standard System will be at 1:00 P.M. Monday, July 27, 2009. Exhibits **MUST BE REMOVED** Wednesday evening or before 8 A.M. Thursday morning.

JUNIORS MUST REGISTER AT THE FAIR SECRETARY'S OFFICE AND RECEIVE AN EXHIBITOR NUMBER.

Exhibitor's name and address must appear on entry tag. All cultivars must be grown by exhibitor and correctly labeled as to variety on the entry tag. More than one entry per class is allowed, providing each entry is a different variety. Cultivars should be well groomed and should be disbudded unless being shown as a stem, spray or scape. Foliage should not be removed. Exhibitor is to furnish clear glass containers for all cultivars. Paper plates will be provided for vegetables. Exhibitors should enter their cultivars in person and be able to correctly identify them at time of entry. Container grown plants should be in possession of exhibitor at least 3 months to be eligible for competition.

The Flower Show Committee shall not be responsible for breakage, theft or loss of property. The committee reserves the right to combine, divide or eliminate classes to insure a uniform show. Judges' decisions are final.

Best of Show – Rosette and \$5.00. Premiums, ribbons and rosette will be awarded as deemed worthy by the judge.

- Class 1-**Any Perennial**--one bloom, disbudded or one spray not disbudded or one spike with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 2-**Marigold**, Large Flowered Variety--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 3-**Marigold**, Small Flowered Variety--one spray, not disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 4-**Zinnia**, Large Flowered Variety--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 5-**Petunia**--one spray (more than one bloom) any variety, not disbudded with foliage attached, named.
- Class 6-**Any Other Annual Flower**--one bloom, disbudded with foliage attached or one spray not disbudded or one spike with foliage attached, any variety, named.
- Class 7-**Any Root Vegetable**--three vegetables of same named variety. Example: beets, carrots, onions, potatoes etc.
- Class 8-**Any Vine Vegetable**--one vegetable --any named variety. Example: squash, cucumbers etc.
- Class 9-**Any Bush Vegetable**--three vegetables of same named variety. Example: peas, peppers, tomatoes etc.
- Class 10-**Green Beans**--five pods, any variety, named.
- Class 11- **Any Other Vegetable** - not listed above -- any variety, named.
- Class 12-**Container Grown Plant**--one plant per pot (may be multiple stemmed), any variety, named.

DIVISION IV - JUNIOR ARTISTIC SHOW

RULES:

Open to any member of a 4-H Club or to any junior gardener 19 years and younger. No entry fee or reservation needed. Entries will be accepted from 8:00 A.M. to 11:30 A.M., Thursday, July 30, 2009. Open oral judging by the OAGC Standard System will be at 1:00 P.M., Thursday, July 30, 2009. Entries may not be removed until Sunday, August 2, 2009 from **1:00 P.M. to 2:00 P.M.** Premium checks may be obtained from Audrey Spearman at that time.

Exhibitor's name and address must appear on entry tag. Exhibitor may make one entry per class. Plant material used in the arrangement must be listed on a 3 x 5 card to accompany the arrangement.

No artificial plant material may be used. Painted material is permitted in classes 1,2,4,5,6,and 8. No fresh plant material may be painted. Accessories are permitted in any class.

Arrangements must be completely assembled before reaching the entry and classification table. Arrangements are to be staged under the direction of the placement committee. Exhibitors should enter their arrangements in person and should be able to identify plant material used.

Caution will be exercised, but the committee is not responsible for breakage, theft or loss of property. Judges' decisions are final.

Best of Show - Rosette and \$5.00—Section A (classes 1-4) and Section B (classes 5-8)

Premiums, ribbons and rosettes will be awarded as deemed worthy by the judge.
